Program Background:

Umatilla Elementary School would like to purchase a more cost effective and up to date interactive projection display for each classroom. We are a Title 1 School with 67.39% of the population having free and reduced status. This year all of our students receive free lunch. School enrollment is 630 students and has 38 classrooms. Currently, we have 4 Interactive Smartboards. These Smartboards are at least 13 years old or older. Due to the Smartboards becoming obsolete, our district Technology Support is not renewing the software or installing the programs. Every classroom is equipped with a Dell or Epson projector. Replacement bulbs are \$99.00 per projector. The cost for the projector is \$327.00. Most of the projectors only have a two-year warranty. Teachers use the projector display on a daily basis.

Project Summary:

These interactive displays would help all of our students be more successful in the "real world" classroom and expand the learning environment beyond the classroom. This technology connects all subject area skills and standards to student learning. It will utilize technology through STEM as well as digital learning. Teachers can utilize opportunities to differentiate instruction and enhance student creativity, which ultimately impacts all of our learners.

Need: \$3,000.00 per classroom to purchase a Viewsonic interactive television projector with a touch screen. The Lake County Schools AV Department provided pricing and specifications. Other Lake County elementary schools are using the Viewsonics. Depending upon how the teacher wants to present the lesson, the motorized mount can raise or lower the screen. This feature allows more student interaction.

Project Goals and Objectives:

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The objectives for this project are to engage students and teachers in interactive lessons, virtual field trips, authentic literature and STEM activities. Students and teachers will "Read, Write, Think, and Talk" together. Project goals are to "boost" media literacy, improve students' learning by providing opportunities for student led discussions, student creativity, critical thinking, and tools for collaborative technologies.

Evaluation Plan: Describe how you will measure outcomes and evaluate your project. Outcomes will be measured by teacher and student feedback, observation of student use, student projects, and STEM activities.
